

Johnson sentences 2 to prison terms

Two people were sentenced to prison terms on Friday by 74th State District Judge Derwood Johnson.

Herman Lee Johnson was sentenced to two years in prison after his probation was revoked for failure to report to his probation officer and for failure to pay court fees.

He had been placed on probation after a conviction for burglary of a motor vehicle.

Everett Eugene Davis was given a two-year prison sentence after he pleaded guilty Friday to a felony charge of driving while intoxicated.

Also Friday, Ricky Dean Lucas was placed on

probation for 10 years after pleading guilty to a robbery charge.

Doris Jean Degrate pleaded guilty to two counts of felony theft, and Johnson ordered a pre-sentence investigation to determine if she is eligible for a probated sentence. Prosecutors recommended three years probation on each charge.

Bruce Edward Jones pleaded guilty to charges of burglary of a building and felony theft. Prosecutors recommended punishment at either three years in prison or a 10-year probated sentence. Johnson ordered an investigation to determine if he is qualified for probation before sentencing him.
